150 Huddle In Bid to Save Lark

LARK - More than 150 persons met Monday night to form a committee to find a solution to the threat of discontinued water and sewage service to the 122 families of this mining community.

The previous supplier of water and sewage services to the town, U.S. Smelting, Refining and Mining Co., all but shut down its mining operations at the beginning of the year, laying olf 305 miners and other workers.

The company has not guaranteed continuance of the service.

7-Man Committee

Chosen to head a seven-man committee was Jack Whitmore, who said if the town doesn't get together and find a solution, it will die.

Mr. Whitmore explained the company has supplied water to the town for many years from a reservoir five miles inside an abandoned mine tunnel. He said filters are in operation which remove iron particles and sediment, but are not necessary, noting culinary water was supplied for many years without the filters.

Sewage System

The sewage system, Mr. Whitmore pointed out, consists of feeder collection lines dumping into five aereation ponds which treat the raw sewage. He said the ponds require constant maintenance, and a serious problem could potentially develop if maintenance were not carried out on an almost daily basis. However, the company still

is providing water and sewage upkeep, he said.

Don Willey, company spokesman at the meeting, said the firm has more than \$200,000 invested in the water system — electrical cables, pumps, filters, and switching equipment — and is certain to salvage it and move it to another operation.

Accents Problem

"It would be almost impossible for a community of this size to take over the equipment," he said, citing the cost of buying it from the company
