\$28 million he estimated as the value of the heavier equipment.

(In Detroit, auto industry officials said the \$28 million would buy nearly 10,000 tractors rather than the 500 tractors or bulldozers originally stipulated as the ransom for 1,214 prisoners.)

Castro scaled down the number of prisoners available for exchange, saying the original figure of 1,214 captives included a number of innocent peasants arrested by mistake.

In addition to the 1,173 invaders he is willing to trade for tractors, Castro said his government is holding the three leaders, 16 "war criminals" and three priests who will be released through diplomatic channels.
